

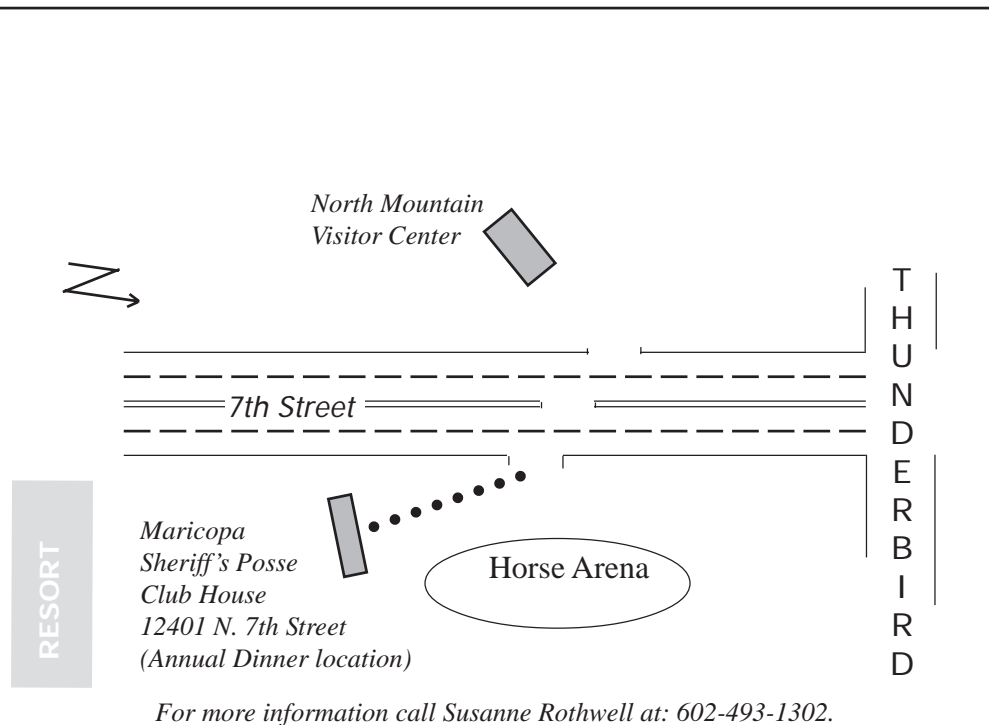

Learn from Cheryl Charles about the growing efforts to keep today's children connected with nature and the outdoors at the PMPC Annual Dinner.

The Guest Speaker is President and co-founder, with Richard Louv and others, of the Children & Nature Network (C&NN), a non-profit organization dedicated to building a movement to re-connect children and nature.

Cheryl will speak about the growing disconnect between children and nature, the indicators of what Richard Louv calls “nature deficit disorder,” and the scientific as well as common-sense evidence of the benefits to children from direct experience with nature on a daily basis in their lives.

Grounded in research as well as experience, Cheryl offers practical suggestions for action by parents, grandparents, physicians, urban planners, architects, designers, business leaders, public officials, academics, educators and others concerned about the nature of childhood, the health of communities and the future of the Earth.

Among her many interests, she has demonstrated a life-long commitment to the importance of getting children into the out-of-doors—for their health, success and happiness. She helped establish and is President and CEO of the Children and Nature Network (www.cnaturenet.org), co-founded in 2006 with author Richard Louv. The C&NN has launched a campaign to Leave No Child Inside, inspired in part by Richard Louv's book, *Last Child in the Woods: Saving Our Children from Nature-Deficit Disorder*.

Enjoy seeing old friends, making new ones, a delicious dinner plus a stimulating speaker that is working to reconnect all of us to the value of the out-of-doors.
